
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

Erroneous Teaching—Again and again we shall be called to meet the influence of men who are studying sciences of satanic origin, through which Satan is working to make a nonentity of God and of Christ. The Father and the Son each have a personality. Christ declared, "I and My Father are one." Yet it was the Son of God who came to the world in human form. Laying aside His royal robe and kingly crown, He

clothed His divinity with humanity, that humanity through His infinite sacrifice might become partakers of the divine nature, and escape the corruption that is in the world through lust.—Testimonies For The Church 9:68 (1909).

Positive Truth Versus Spiritualistic Representations—I am instructed to say, The sentiments of those who are searching for advanced scientific ideas are not to be trusted. Such representations as the following are made: "The Father is as the light invisible: the Son is as the light embodied; the Spirit is the light shed abroad." "The Father is like the dew, invisible vapor; the Son is like the dew gathered in beauteous form; the Spirit is like the dew fallen to the seat of life." Another representation: "The Father is like the invisible vapor; the Son is like the leaden cloud;

the Spirit is rain fallen and

working in refreshing power."

All these spiritualistic representations are simply nothingness. They are imperfect, untrue. They weaken and diminish the Majesty which no earthly likeness can be compared to. God cannot be compared with the things His hands have made. These are mere earthly things, suffering under the curse of God because of the sins of man. The Father cannot be described by the things of earth. The Father is all the fullness of the Godhead bodily, and is invisible to mortal sight.

The Son is all the fullness of the Godhead manifested. The Word of God declares Him to be "the express image of His person." "God so loved the world, that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Here is shown the personality of the Father.

The Comforter that Christ promised to send after He ascended to heaven, is the Spirit in all the fullness of the Godhead, making manifest the power of divine grace to all who receive and believe in Christ as a personal Saviour. There are three living persons of the heavenly trio; in the name of these three great powers—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—those who receive Christ by living faith are baptized, and these powers will co-operate with the obedient subjects of heaven in their efforts to live the new life in Christ.—Special

Testimonies, Series B, No. 7, pp. 62, 63. (1905).

The Pre-existent, Self-existent Son of God.... In speaking of his pre-existence, Christ carries the mind back through dateless ages. A Holy Spirit Report

In this report we will look at the Holy Spirit from 3 sources. The Bible, The Spirit of Prophecy, and The Elijah message (Shepherd's Rod). Before we start we are told from SOP the following —

"The nature of the Holy Spirit is a mystery. Men cannot explain it, because the Lord has not revealed it to them. Men having fanciful views may bring together passages of Scripture and put a human construction on them, but the acceptance of these views will not strengthen the church. Regarding such mysteries, which are too deep for human understanding, silence is golden." (AA, p.52)

So despite our striving to know all we want on the Holy Spirt, it will remain a mystery until it is revealed at God's time. Things such as — does the Holy Spirit have a bodily form, why is there no throne spoken of in the Bible for the Holy Spirit to sit upon, like the Father and Son, etc.?

But we do have sufficent evidence from Inspiration to make, according to our finite understanding, a good idea of who and what the Holy Spirit is. God did not withhold light on this subject.

THE BIBLE:

What did Christ say about the Holy Spirit?

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." (John 14:26)

"But when the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness about me." (John 15:26)

"Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you." (John 16:7)

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever,

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20)

Notice something clearly. Jesus continually referred to the Holy Spirit as "he" and "him". Now, there are some who make the argument that Jesus is talking about Himself in the third person. For example in John 17:1-5 it says

"These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee: As thou hast given him power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him. And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent. I have glorified thee on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do. And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was."

But let us now show from the Bible that the Holy Spirit a separate and distinct Being.

Now let's compare that to John 16:13-14.

"However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authourity, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come. He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you.

As Jesus won't glorify Himself, this shows someone else (a separate being) as able to glorify Him.

Next look at how The Father and Son are within each other.

"Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me" (John 14:11)

"Abide in Me and I in you." (John 15:5)

"At that day you will know that I am in My Father, and you in Me, and I in you." (John 14:20)

"Don't you believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words I speak are not my own, but my Father who lives in me does his work through me." (John 14:10)

Now, because the Father is in Christ, and Christ is in the Father can we now say the Father or Christ is not a separate and distinct Being? Likewise when we read that the Holy Spirit comes from the Father and Son and lives in us, we cannot say He is not a separate distinct Being. As they all exist within each other, we that are limited in human understanding, must accept the fact that the Triune Godhead exists. This is an example of



"And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." (John 20:22), cannot prove the Holy Spirit is not a separate distinct Being. Again, this is part of the mystery of the Holy Spirit.

"For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Spirit: and these three are one." (1 John 5:7)

SPIRIT OF PROPHECY:

THE ROD:

We as Davidian SDA know that our Fundamnetal Beliefs are our core doctrines of faith, a summary of what we believe. In them we find FB no. 2 on page 4 of FB Tract, the following —

"2. That the Godhead, or Trinity, consists of the Eternal Father, a personal. spiritual Being, omnipotent, omnipresent, omniscient, infinite in wisdom and love; the Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of the Eternal Father, through whom all things were created and through whom the salvation of the redeemed hosts will be accomplished; the Holv Spirit, the third person of the Godhead, the great regenerating power in the work of redemption. Matt. 28:19.

Some try to explain away the meaning of "person". This leads to confusion and down a road of doubtful faith in what the clear obvious meaning of words are. The prophet viewed it as a person, a living separate distinct person, so should we.

How do we know this? God revealed to him, and now to us, the meaning of Ezekiel 4 prophecy (the grains). In this revealing, it is shown that John Knox's teaching brought the "Truth of the Holy Spirit" from God. Knox clearly taught that the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Godhead. A Triune Godhead consisting of God the Father, Christ the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

In closing let us stand firm on our fundamental beliefs, remembering this about our arch enemy —

"Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour." (1 Peter 5:8)



"What greater deception can come upon human minds than a confidence that they are right, when they are all wrong! The message of the True Witness finds the people of God in a sad deception, yet honest in that deception. They know not that their condition is deplorable in the sight of God. Seven years experience in this message has repeatedly proved that Present Truth believers have not yet fully recovered from the "sad deception"; especially is this the case of parents and guardians. They seem utterly unable to look with wise, unbiased, unimpassioned

judgment upon the problem of their children, for which they themselves are responsible. Satan seems almost completely to have blinded them with parental sentimentalism, until at last we are duty bound to lift warning voice, lest parents and children together perish in their deception.

A similar state of affairs existed in the days, of Elijah. Church, home and school "had fallen into decay during the years of Israel's apostasy," and thus remained until Elijah came and restored them. His work of reestablishing the schools of the prophets, "making provision for young men to gain an education that would lead them to magnify the law of God and make it honorable," was essentially one of making the institution of the school an agency in restoring and uniting church and home, and reconciling parents and children.

Now, in this day of deepest apostasy, when church, home, and school are in



the very death throes of decay, Elijah must again restore as the Scriptures say, "all things." And, according to type, the restored institution of the schools of the prophets is again to stand as a coordinating influence between church and home, parent and child.

"Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the Lord. And He shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children' and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth with a curse." (Mal. 4:5, 6.)

Hence, as Mt. Carmel Academy is the school of the Elijah message, the prophet of today, it is therefore, that warning voice which is come to awake parents and children out of their "sad deception," and to educate them away from their natural habits of life, and bring them into obedience to the divine precepts, laws, and statutes, thus turning "the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers," and saving them from that dreadful day when the Lord shall come and smite the earth with a curse."

There would be no sinful neglect to restrain the evil propensities of his children, no weak, unwise, indulgent favoritism: no yielding of his conviction of duty to the claims of mistaken affection. Abraham would not only give right instruction, but he would maintain the authority of just and righteous laws.

"How few there are in our day who follow this example! On the part of too many parents there is a blind and selfish sentimentalism, miscalled love, which is manifested in leaving children, with their unformed judgment and undisciplined passions, to the control of their own will. 

After having read the inspired quote, I share with you what current science has discovered regarding fruits and vegetables in a state of decomposition, which ferment in the stomach and produce blood poisoning.

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES IN A STATE OF DECOMPOSITION.

Have you ever cut off the affected part of a fruit or vegetable that is already rotten and eaten the part that is supposed to be in good condition to be eaten? Well, if you have, don't do it again. Because doing so causes your immune system to react causing a diarrhea to get rid of what is causing you harm and even an anaphylactic shock due to food allergy.

What is anaphylactic shock? Anaphylactic shock is a severe and potentially life-threatening reaction of the immune system to an antigen that a person has been exposed to before. The reaction can include itching of the skin, edema, collapse of blood vessels, fainting, difficulty breathing and death.

An antigen is the molecular structure found on the surface of viruses and the immune system. They are capable of triggering a type of immune response known as antibody production.

Some fungi that develop in fruits and vegetables in a state of decomposition are capable of producing highly dangerous substances, the so-called mycotoxins (mycotoxins are substances derived from fungi that can cause chronic intoxications capable of producing cancer of the kidney, liver, stomach, (leukemia, blood cancer), etc.). And as they are resistant to heat and any disinfectant is better to discard the vegetables, fruits or any food that is in a state of decay, because although (appears to be in good condition) and smell good, taste good, is already contaminated by fungi by their spores and these are still colonizing and eating them contaminate you, poisoned and poisoned the whole body.

On one occasion, Martha, perplexed by the eagerness to prepare the meal, appealed to Christ saying, "Lord, are you not careful that my sister leaves me to serve alone? Tell her, then, to help me." This happened on the occasion of Christ's first visit to Bethany. The Savior and his disciples had just made a painful journey on foot from Jericho. Martha was anxious to provide for their comfort, and in her anxiety she forgot the courtesy due to her guest. Jesus answered her with words full of gentleness and patience: "Martha, Martha, thou art careful, and with the many things thou art troubled: but one thing is needful; and Mary hath chosen the

Mary hath chosen the good part, which shall not be taken away from her." Mary treasured in her mind the precious words that fell from the

Savior's lips, words that were more precious to her than the costliest jewels on this earth. The "one thing" that Martha needed was a Spirit of calmness and devotion, a deeper anxiety for knowledge concerning the future and immortal life, and the graces necessary for spiritual progress. She needed less concern for passing things and more for things that last forever. Jesus wants to teach his children to take advantage of every opportunity to gain the knowledge that will make them wise for salvation. The cause of Christ needs people who work with care and energy. There is ample scope for the Martas with their zeal for active religious work. But they must first sit with Mary at the feet of Jesus. Let diligence, alacrity and energy be sanctified by the Grace of Christ; and then life will be an irresistible power for good. DA 525





Knowing that the Jews' servitude to a pagan nation was the result of their stubbornness in rejecting God's rebukes.

They feared that by plotting against Jesus, the priests and rulers were following in the footsteps of their fathers, and would bring new calamities upon the nation.
